



hibiscus

Hibiscus have huge, dinner-plate size flowers in shades of pink, red and white. Bi-color, double and dark eye forms look phenomenal when combined with solid colors. Your hibiscus will be the talk of the town as they attract butterflies and hummingbirds!

Site Preference: For best flower performance, grow Hibiscus in full sun (8 or more hours of direct sunlight).

Soil: Hibiscus do well in most conditions, however they love moist conditions. They can easily naturalize troublesome wet areas. The addition of **Sphagnum Peat** and **Composted Manure** will assure a healthy planting. These products will help to nurture the plant, hold moisture and aerate the soil.

Watering, Planting, Dividing: See instructions included in the *Perennials - General Care* sheet.

Winter Care: Hibiscus overwinter best when cut back in spring before new growth appears. New growth is one of the last to emerge in spring, usually starting late May to early June.

Note: **Sphagnum Peat** and **Composted Manure** are available near the Tree and Shrub cashier's booth. A variety of mulches can be purchased by the bag in the Tree and Shrub department.
